celebrated the 100th Day of


School. The students dressed up as they imagined they would look at age 100. In class, they worked

with dementia as well as memory loss.


The club spread holiday cheer with their festive stockings. The contents of the merry stockings were two handmade ornaments, tissues, chocolate candy, warm and

Pete Johnson became Grahamwood Elementary's principal twelve years ago and has served very ably ever


since. His classroom background helps him relate to the needs and concerns of students, parents, and teachers.
